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BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting and comply with the applicable Accounting Standards as notified under the Companies Act, 2013.

II. USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles ('GAAP') in India requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities on the date of the financial statements. Management believes that the estimates made in the preparation of financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Actual future period's results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in current and future periods.

III. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized when the right to receive payment is established.

(b) Fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes purchase cost and all incidental expenses to bring the asset to their present location and condition.

Depreciation is provided under down value method at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 2013. Assets costing less than Rs. 5,000 each are depreciated at full in the year of purchase.

(c) Investments

Company does not have any investments.

(d) Inventories

Company does not have any inventories.

(e) Provisions and contingencies

The Company creates a provision when there is present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are recognized for the future tax consequences attributable to timing differences that result between the profits offered for income taxes and the profits as per the financial statements. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using the tax rates and the tax laws that have

been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. The effect of a change in tax rates on deferred tax assets and liabilities is recognized in the year that includes the enactment date.

Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent there is reasonable certainty that the assets can be realized in the future, however, where there is unabsorbed depreciation or carried forward loss under taxation laws, deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is virtual certainty, supported by convincing evidence of recognition of such assets. Deferred tax assets are reassessed for the appropriateness of their respective carrying values at each balance sheet date.
